Report

- South East Edinburgh Greens Annual Report 2020-21
- This report covers the period August 2020 to June 2021. It was a shorter year
- because 2019-20 was extended, in line with Edinburgh Branch, because of the
- 5 Covid-19 pandemic.
- 6 Green News
- As usual, we produced Liberton/Gilmerton and Southside/Newington editions of
- 8 Green News in the Autumn. Owing to concerns from delivery co-ordinators about
- not having enough volunteers because of the pandemic, we delivered fewer than
- usual:
- Liberton/Gilmerton: 3,500
- Southside/Newington: 10,000
- The Spring edition was produced by the national office for the Holyrood 2021 campaign.

Fundraising and Finances

- With no capitation income this year we set a £300 fundraising target to cover
- potential costs, however the only expenditure that we had this year was for a
- staple gun, used for putting posters on A-boards for the elections.

19 Auction of Promises

- We asked branch members to submit a promise something that they'd make (e.g. a
- crumble), or have already created (e.g. a handmade bag), or could do for someone
- else (e.g. cello lessons).
- Promises were put up for auction via Facebook between 8 and 18 December, when
- the highest bids were announced.
- £270 was raised.

- Robin.

- This campaign was all about delivering printed materials, as we were unable to
- canvass or have street stalls. The national campaign office produced a long list
- of materials to be delivered in a relatively short space of time.
- Initially we were pessimistic about how much we could achieve. However, the
- Lothian campaign support officers were good at increasing our volunteer capacity
- (e.g. through phone banking) and in the end we delivered well over 25,000 items,
- made up of:
- Spring Newsletter
- Election Special Newsletter
- Postal vote letters
- Campaign cards
- Eve of poll cards
- Day of poll cards
- We also delivered 250 window posters to supporters and members and put out A-
- boards at 17 polling stations.
- Following the election, we had a thank-you social for volunteers at The
- Salisbury Arms. This was attended by around 28 people, including many new
- volunteers who got involved for the first time during the campaign.

- We now have 220 members in our two council wards. This is an increase of 10% in the past year, and is at its highest for over 5 years.
